Shutter Cons

Always in Sight

Unlike a curtain or blind which can be drawn or raised, shutters are always visible. While this is great for privacy, homeowners who always want a full view to the outside may have an issue.

Impedes Furniture Placement

The majority of shutters require ample space in front of them as they open inwards like a door. This means you can't, for example, place a couch directly anterior to the shutters as they require at least the width of the panel to be clear in front. This can affect furniture placement when decorating.
